- Cooperating with any requests for information from a contact tracer.


We will all receive a daily text message as a reminder to go through a symptom check before coming to work on campus or entering a building for class.

- Required as part of the OSHE Restart Standard




Title IX

The Department of Education (ED) new rules went into effect this past 8/14. Some of the new rules involve:

- Colleges no longer have to designate most employees as "mandatory reporters".
- Colleges can no longer use the common single-investigator model, in which an investigator writes a report and recommends a finding, but no hearing takes place.
- Colleges must investigate off-campus sexual misconduct that occurs in educational activities, such as college-owned buildings and college-sponsored trips, but not in off-campus apartments or during study abroad.
- Students can never cross-examine each other personally. Colleges must ensure that both parties have an adviser who will pose questions on their behalf.
- Colleges can raise the bar for what constitutes a violation of campus policy and, therefore, merits punishment. preponderance-of-evidence standard vs. clear and convincing




Registrations by Mode of Instruction






Freshman Application / Enrollment Update






Transfer Registration/Enrollment Update

Transfer Enrollments	694	603	-13%




Graduate Registration/Enrollment Update

Graduate Enrollments	594	589	-1%




Summer Enrollment Update

Coronavirus Relief Funds (CRF)

- NJCU submitted and was awarded its Grant application for the GEER Funds
- —This application also guided the Coronavirus Relief Funds the State will allocate.
- Of the first tranche of 150M of CRF funds, NJCU was awarded 6.9M



State Budget

Funding for Senior Publics should be kept flat from last year

Additionally, NJCU was able to successfully advocate for additional monies for the Fort Monmouth Project. This is important for a number of reasons:

It continues to show the State's confidence in the project

It further improves the feasibility of the project's assumptions

It is worth noting that only NJCU and Stockton kept additional allocations from the previous year; every other school saw those removed by the Governor.
