Program Description

The Master of Arts in Teaching in Early Childhood/Special Education leads to dual certification in Preschool through Grade Three and Teacher of Students with Disabilities. Candidates learn what is needed to provide high-quality early childhood programs and prepares candidates to teach in inclusive settings for young children with exceptional needs.

Admission Requirements to any NJCU Education Program

- Cumulative GPA of 3.0 or above. A grade of B- or lower in an education course may require that the course be repeated.
- Passing scores on the Praxis CORE, or 1100 or higher on the SAT (560 on verbal and 540 on math), or 23 or higher on each section of the ACT, or 311 or higher on the GRE (155 verbal and 156 quantitative)
- Passing scores on the Praxis CORE Academic Skills for Educators Tests, as of 9/1/15:
 - o Math Test #5732 Passing Score 150
 - Reading Test #5712 Passing Score 156
 - o Writing Test #5722 Passing Score 162

Program Completion Requirements

- A passing score on the Early Childhood Content Knowledge Praxis II Exam (5025). Always confirm the correct test code of any Praxis test. Praxis II must be passed prior to Clinical Practice.
- A minimum cumulative GPA of 3.0
- Successful completion of Early Childhood Education Clinical Experience and Clinical Practice
